✓ Civic Center Report

-This December's numbers doubled that of last year -Masking is still required in common areas but not while actively exercising

- Fairview's Gemini Center member numbers were 420. Which is 13-15 per day and is not impacting our members. Their closure has been pushed back further and might want some compensation if this continues

- New carpet in front of the gym to the double doors going to fitness/pool side, also in the back hallway to the left of the entrance. It is carpet tiles so they can be piece replaced if damaged, some of the current tile is failing so it will be replaced with carpet. Install to begin at end of February.

-New Dumbbells- repurposed old ones, half to the track and half to the new police station.

- Looking at new Spin Bikes- old ones are 10-12years old

- Demo Week was 1/2/22-1/9/22

-Learn to Swim classes are full- mainly due to staff shortage, new masters swim class(adults)- up to 12/class, they have cut private lessons

Staffing

Increased hourly pay for part time staff from \$8.80-11/hour, up to \$9.75-15/hour Openings- filled one full time position George Carrado took over Jeff Waddell's job after his retirement. Vacancy still for Full Time Custodian at Civic to replace Mick- a union job, Service Dept. guy backed out as his replacement, on to reposting job

- Launched new website for the recreation department through the city page, rrcity.com/recreation. Looking for feedback
- Next week to finalize Safety Town as a permanent facility to host. 12-14 structures. Utilizing the space behind the Civic Center and next to the outdoor Pool. Rec department will only be covering the registration, Police will run the program. Westshore Tech said they would work with us to build structures and decorate.

Projects:

Large Purchases- Zamboni, Flooring for indoor turf replacement, Girls Locker Room at the Ice Rinkcurrently use the pavilion bathroom as their changing space- would like to expand to have shower and lockers- lots of opportunity but picking the right one is key

Questions:

Dr. Ulchaker asked how many people are being affected by changing area for girls currently. Not many but we need to be compliant for title 9. We have received one quote of \$30,000 without flooring cost.

Where do other facilities stand with female Facilities? If there are 2 sheets of ice, usually have enough room for separate locker rooms, we are similar to most other 1 sheet ice rinks in that we are lacking a female specific locker room. Could market well to females to come to River Rink. Diana Leitch noted that all 3 groups (School, Backers, and Rec) funded the High School locker room. We could try to do that again for a Girls Hockey Locker Room

- Morley Park- getting a new structure for 2022. Only big park project. Paths at both Linden and RR Park are being looked at it.
