Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting Meeting Minutes April 14th, 2022

- Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 7:47am. This meeting was held in person at the Ice Rink Pavilion. Members present: Jim Ulchaker, Joe Roszak, Diana Leitch, Dave Furry. Also present: Bob Holub, Krissie Miller, Jason Frolo, and Erica Garland.
- Approval of Minutes: minutes from March 10th, 2022 were approved as submitted. Dave Furry motioned and Joe Roszak 2nd.

• Fees for Approval:

- 1. **Youth Basketball**; Jr. Cavs Partnership: a youth basketball program for grades 2-8, proposed increase of fee by \$20. Previous: \$90/\$95/\$105, proposed fees: \$110/\$115/\$125. Motion to approve by Diana Leitch, 2nd by Dave Furry.
- 2. **Youth Football program**: grades 3-8; padded flag, modified tackle (4th and 5th graders, 7x7), 11v11 tackle. 7 games per season. Previous fees: Mem \$150/Res \$155. Proposed fees: Mem \$160/ Res \$165. Motion to approve by Dave Furry, 2nd by Diana Leitch.

• Civic Center Report:

Indoor Pool- glass was found in pool, it was drained, cleaned and scrubbed, vacuumed and refilled in about a weeks-time. Currently heating and leveling chemicals to be open Saturday. The best guess on where the glass came from is that it was a broken snorkel mask. The annual maintenance will still proceed but it may be shorter due to the pool already being cleaned. March had 13,000 visits. Sock Hop is being cancelled due to no one signing up. Next community event is June 11th, Family Health and Fitness Day. It will be held at Linden Park. Currently registration is going on for coach pitch, t-ball and softball season, along with Learn to swim (which is almost full already)

• Director's Report:

Highest revenue in March, memberships are up, programs are at capacity. Day Camp has long waitlist, but we are struggling with hiring.

Projects: Morley Park- there were 6 vendors to bid, Schneider Recreation is who was chosen. The fact that the structures were a 5-12 year old based and a dedicated 2-5 year old structure drove this decision. The city will only be doing removal of old park structures and site prep, the playground company will do everything else. It is a pocket park but the local residents use it heavily.

Safety Town: the buildings are done, layout and engineering is next, Cox Communication will be helping to prime and paint the houses at a community outreach.

Summer Programming: Summer of Fun, Memory Lane Car Show, and Summer Concert Series. Zamboni and Multipurpose flooring for the rink have both been ordered as they were just passed through Council.

Silver Sneakers is still down from Covid, the Senior Center has taken over all of the land based classes, pool classes are still at the rec. Rates have not been changed so the senior center charges the same.

Aquatics and safety class participation are up. Request for Broga and Zumba to come back throughout the community.
